Gates Millennium ScholarshipAmount: The total cost of presenceDeadline: SeptemberBill & Melinda Gates Foundation awards the Millennium Scholarship to 300 top students each year. The scholarship covers all participation costs not covered by financial aid or family contributions, and includes tuition fees and fees, books, room, board and transportation. You must complete the free application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to apply, be in the top 10% of your graduation class and demonstrate leadership and personal success. Horatio Alger Scholarship ProgramsAmount: \$25,000Deadline: October Horatio Alger Scholarships assist high school students who have faced and overcome adversity and show financial need. No village or ACT is required for any of the Horatio Alger scholarships. If you start your studies at a two-year college and then transfer to a four-year college or university, you are still eligible to apply. Students awarded this scholarship take a trip all expenses paid to Washington DC to receive their grant. Siemens Competition in Mathematics, Science and Technology ScholarshipsMount: \$25,000 to \$100,000Deadline: SeptemberDiscovery Education Sponsors Siemens Competition, which encourages individual students and team members in the U.S. to explore scientific interests. There are both National and Regional Siemens scholarships, with prizes going to 1, 2 and 3. The national program awards scholarships worth \$25,000 to \$100,000, while regional prizes \$6,000 to \$10,000. Coca-Cola BursaMount: \$20,000Deadline: OctoberCoca-Cola Scholars Program scholarships awards 150 students based on achievement each year. It looks for well-rounded and service-oriented high school seniors looking to make a difference in their school and community. The Gold Medal Portfolio AwardAmount: \$10,000Deadline: VarietiesThe Gold Medal Portfolio Award is open to high school graduates who present a portfolio of eight unique written or art pieces that show technical skills, personal voice and originality. It awards 16 Gold Medal recipients with \$10,000 and 30 Silver Medal recipients with \$1,000 scholarships. 5 Scholarships \$50,000Deadline: DecemberTwenty 5 Strong Scholarships are awarded to minority students each year. The 5 Strong Foundation helps minority high school graduate students and get admission to historical black colleges and universities. Universities. Burger King Scholars ProgramAmount: \$1,000 to \$50,000Dealline: DecemberFounded in memory of Burger King founder James McLamore, the Burger King Scholars program is intended to offset the cost of attending college. Prizes are awarded to students on the basis of their GPA, extracurricular activities, work experience and community services. Scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$50,000. Ronald McDonald House Charity ScholarshipsAmount: \$1,000 + Deadline: JanuaryRonald McDonald House Scholarships are awarded through chapters of Ronald McDonald's House Charity (RMHC). There are a variety of scholarships available for high school seniors, each with different eligibility requirements. Some depend on a student's ethnicity, while others are based on financial need. The value of the scholarship and the deadlines depend on the local chapter RHMC. Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship ProgramAmount: Up to \$30,000Deadline: The FebruaryThe Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship Program not only addresses the financial needs of minority students, but also provides mentoring services, internships and employment opportunities. Students can receive up to \$30,000 over four years. To apply, answer a variety of essay questions, provide a digital photo and a letter of recommendation from an employer, teacher, counselor or mentor. otherwise can I pay for school? Chances are a scholarship won't cover your entire college and expenses. Other ways to pay for college before considering taking up debt include: Grants. Usually reserved for students in financial need, you do not have to pay back a subsidy as long as you meet all your obligations. They are offered by private organizations, universities, states and the federal government, and you will need to complete FAFSA to apply. Federal work study. Federal work study programs typically offer full-time and part-time jobs at thousands of U.S. schools. Employment through college is a good way to fund college spending. Some jobs may even match your degree program, giving you work experience. Fill in FAFSA to apply. Employer reimbursement programs. Depending on your major, your employer could offer a tuition refund program. Usually you have to work a certain amount of hours and be enrolled either full-time or part-time in college. Some programs require you to work for the company after graduating from college, while others do not. A scholarship is a good way to help cover the costs of college tuition without piling on debt. But if you are going to become a permanent student at a foreign school, you can't apply. The Displaced Homemaker ScholarshipsAmount: \$1,500Deadline: MayThe Association on American Indian Affairs offers scholarships to students over 30 years of age attending college for the first time or re-entering college after a break to raise a family. Prizes are \$750 each semester, which can be used to fund your education or pay for living and child care expenses. Scholarships may be renewed. Nontraditional Student ScholarshipAmount: \$2,000Deadline: MarchThis scholarship funded by the American Legion helps nontraditional parents starting a degree program or are picking up where they left off. Winners are selected based on financial needs, personal goals, academic achievements, leadership and character. A scholarship is awarded in each auxiliary geographical division. PEO Program for Continuing Education Scholar: Up to \$3,000Deadline: MarchThe Philanthropic Education Organization (PEO) The continuing education scholarship program is open to women whose education has been put on hold for at least 24 months, and are ready to pursue a degree or earn a certificate. Online courses are accepted, but women looking for a PhD are not eligible. Patsy Takemoto Mink Education Scholarship for MomsAmount: Up to \$5,000Deadline: MarchPatsy Takemoto Mink was the first BIPOC woman to be elected to the U.S. House of Representatives. In her honour, scholarships are awarded each year to women in financial need, especially mothers, to help reduce the costs of education or to child care. Five prizes of up to \$5,000 are awarded in the spring each year. Ford Opportunity ScholarshipAmount: Up to \$40,000Deadline: MarchThe Ford Family Foundation grants scholarships to single mothers who want to get their associate or license. Bursa Bursa 90% of costs not covered by other grants and grants. You must be a single parent of dependent children and head of the household. Up to 50 renewable scholarships are awarded each year. Soroptimist Live Your Dreams AwardAmount: Up to \$16,000Deadline: August-NovemberEach Year, the Soroptimist Live Your Dreams Award scholarship provides financial assistance and support to women who are the main players who win in their families. It pays more than \$2.6 million each year to nearly 1,700 women to help offset tuition costs, pay for transportation, purchase books or find reliable child care. Women's Independence Scholarship ProgramAmount: Up to \$8,000Deadline: Applications are accepted throughout the yearThe Women's Independence Scholarship Program is designed to stop the cycle of domestic violence by offering scholarships to single mothers to fund higher education so that women can get back on their feet. Only full-time or part-time students with critical financial needs are eligible. Returning students must have at least one GPA 2.75 to reapply. otherwise can I pay for school? Scholarships are a great way for mothers to fund their education, but they are not the only option. You have other options. Federal Pell Grant. A grant based on the need of up to \$6,195 for undergraduate students is offered through the Department of Education. To apply for the grant, you must send FAFSA. Federal work study program. A federal needs-based program, students must work on- or off campus at a part-time job in exchange for money versus the cost of participation. To be considered, you must submit FAFSA. Student loans. Student loans are another way to cover college expenses. But before using private lenders, consider federal loans first, as they often come with lower interest rates and more flexible repayment options. Get a job. Trying to juggle school, a family and a job can be hard. But if you need a little extra money, taking on the hustle or freelancing side might be an option to consider.
